Project Development Internship with IOM Budapest

The International Organization for Migration (IOM) Project Development and Implementation Unit (PDIU) is seeking a Project Development and Fundraising Intern for a full-time, three- or six-month commitment to work at the IOM Office in Budapest starting 06 May 2013.

Responsibilities:

1) Research migration issues within Hungary and within the region to assist with project development activities;

2) Monitor and search for project funding opportunities;

3) Assist with drafting, and editing project proposals;

4) Assist with preparing and finalizing project proposal submission packages to donors;

5) Assist with implementation of projects, including assistance with organizing conferences and other events;

6) Assist in administrative tasks, such as note-taking, writing reports of projects, drafting letters, filing, etc;

7) Performing any other duties as requested.

Requirements:

1) A degree in a relevant field, such as international relations, sociology, political science or law;

2) Strong research and analytical skills;

3) Experience and/or exposure to migration issues or human rights;

4) Excellent spoken and written English required; experience of proofing and/or editing an asset;

5) Excellent spoken and written Hungarian required; experience of proofing and/or editing an asset;

6) Experience with writing project proposals or fundraising is a distinct advantage;

7) Attention to detail, good communication and interpersonal skills;

8) Experience with an international organization or an NGO desirable;
